Our student in Adelaide, Mansuetus Igboka, launched into action to connect his fellow students through organising soccer matches that promote overall wellbeing.




A Minecraft gaming competition was held by the Online Campus team in collaboration with our Student Representative Council at the Ultimo Campus, Sydney.




Navjot is one of our Business students. In his video, you will see the space he calls home in Australia as he takes you on a tour of Brisbane and tells you all about his life in Queensland.

We recognise qualifications from other countries and education systems, such as GCE A-Levels, International Baccalaureate and SAT. We also assess students who have completed Australian equivalent qualifications.

If you don't meet entry requirements for direct admission into our courses, you can apply for a pathway program. See the following page for more details.

Students who have partially completed a degree can apply for direct admission with a credit transfer. You may see this referred to as 'advanced standing', 'exemptions' or 'recognition of prior learning'.

English language requirements

Entry to all courses requires proficiency in English under the English Language Proficiency Requirements.

Torrens University Language Centre (TULC) provides a pathway towards a higher education course. After you successfully complete an English for Academic Purposes course at TULC, you can progress to your chosen degree.

What are the English requirements for my course?

Some courses may require a higher overall score and/or sub-score(s) for entry. These requirements are shown in accordance with the IELTS academic test requirements.

We also accept other English tests. Students will generally need to have achieved one of the following for entry into their chosen course:

- International English Language Testing System (IELTS) 6 with 5.5 in all areas
- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) 60 with a minimum 18 in writing
- Cambridge English Scale Score 169 with 162 in all areas

We know the value of providing opportunities for students to build upon their careers through pathway programs and acknowledgement of prior learning gained through structured courses or through life or work experiences.



Qualification pathways

If you have already completed a qualification, you may be able to credit this against your degree with us, even if it's from another institution. We will carefully review the learning gained from this qualification to ensure we provide you with credit towards our degrees whenever appropriate.

Recognition of prior learning

Learning as the result of work or life experience, self-tuition, hobby or leisure activities (ie. informal learning) or a structured course that does not lead to an officially accredited qualification (ie. non-formal learning) may be credited against your degree with us. Each application is assessed individually, and your experience matched to the learning outcomes of the subjects covered in your course. All claimed work experience must be relevant to the qualification being applied for, and you must provide evidence to support an application for credit based on informal and/or non-formal learning.
